

Dear Faithful,

We know well that St. Joseph was first and foremost a man of God. A man who remained always in silence so as to find God in this silence and to converse with Him in the secret of his soul. He adored Him, contemplated Him at length and opened his heart to the divine words that he heard distinctly, without being subject to the deafening distractions of exterior thoughts. God alone was necessary, and God alone sufficed for him; he knew how to give Him free rein so that His Power could form him at will.

Silence is a necessary condition for communion between souls and for the expression of the love between two beings: is this not an image of the life of the Trinity?

The life of God is silence and that is where we find Him. That is why the devil always tries to keep us in noise, be it exterior or interior, so as to keep up from withdrawing into the Upper Room of our soul where we receive the divine touch that converts us and makes us enter into this holy intimacy.

St. Joseph dwelled in this Upper Room. He never left it, no matter his exterior activity. The life of God completely absorbed him. He is the model for our Christian life that consists in remaining in the presence of what we are doing because we are first of all in the presence of God acting in us; without noise.

A silent man, a man of silence, St. Joseph expressed himself only to speak of God. He was the one who gave the name of Jesus to Mary's Child whose guardian he became. Jesus, meaning Savior: "There is no other name under heaven given to men, whereby we must be saved." (Acts 4:12)

In this respect, St. Joseph was the first apostle of the Redeemer.

This brings us to the question: are we imitators of St. Joseph? Are we souls of silence who remain in the Upper Room? Are our words rare and essential?

Can we recognize ourselves as authentic Christians truly focused on God? Are we witnesses to the Saviour, thirsting after truth and holy happiness, in a world entangled in its own contradictions?

Antoine de Saint-Exupéry, in his Letter to General X, declared, "I hate my day and age with all my strength. Man is dying of thirst. Oh! General, there is only one problem, one single problem in the whole world. That of restoring to men a spiritual meaning, spiritual concerns, of letting rain down upon them something similar to a Gregorian chant."

Is this not the profound meaning of our upcoming pilgrimage on September 2I to St. Joseph's Oratory in Montreal, to honor this Man of the Upper Room, this friend of God?

We will go there to beg him to help us recover our spiritual meaning. May he send down on our country "something similar to a Gregorian chant" so that Canada may rediscover the meaning of her vocation, the meaning of the Ascent, and thus of the Way of Calvary that leads to Our Lord Jesus Christ, the one and only Savior of men and countries.

We look forward to seeing you all there.
